President Jack Brown welcomed the enthusiastic, but rather small crowd of 27 Gyros to our meeting at the German Canadian Club, including our newest member Luc Lascelle (partner Dixie), and guest Vic Silakiewicz.

Cheerio was led by Roger Russell and Grace was offered by Ari (Dutch) Hoeksema.

President Jack reported on the successful mixed golf tournament and thanked Barry Walker and Roger Russell for their help.

John Ross reported that during his recent visit to Winnipeg, he and his wife had the opportunity to visit Al and Betty McClure who are keeping well and keep abreast of our club events through the Gyrolog.

Fred Schulte reported on Gord Rennie who is doing well after a small bout of ill health due to the heat and dehydration. Fred also provided a quick summary of the current balance in the "Funds and Donations" account, with a request for input, ideas and volunteers to help with how the Club should disburse these funds for worthy causes for the public good. Currently, our Club has an endowment fund at the University of Alberta, department of Gerontology with a book value of \$45,000.00 and a market value of \$75,000.00.

GUEST SPEAKER

Our guest speaker, Edmonton Fire Chief Randy Wolsey was introduced by Bill Taylor.

Chief Wolsey is an Albertan born in Cardston and raised in Edmonton having attended the Jasper Place High School. As a member of the Latter Day Saints, he served for two years in England. His career in the Fire Service began in 1972 in Delta BC, where he served for 30 years, the last seven as Fire Chief.

Chief Wolsey began by indicating how he had to overcome the low morale in the Edmonton Fire department by building relationships within the department, by visiting each and every station under his leadership. Another challenge he encountered when he took over was the outdated equipment including some fire trucks with no hoses, no maintenance and no on-going training. He embarked on a long-range strategic plan and he is pleased that today, the Edmonton Fire Department is one of the top in North America.

Chief Wolsey also referred to some other issues that still need to be addressed such as the Building codes. He indicated that some of these codes were instituted in the 50's and 60's and that today's fires are much more serious; hence these codes need to be updated. Other challenges facing the City of Edmonton is the growth factor, and maintaining the infrastructure. Today, Edmonton is another big "metro" city.

Other significant issues that he pointed to:

- 1 in 7 persons, will not hear the home fire alarm; strobe lights could be used to mitigate this situation;
- it costs 200 million to staff the fire department;
- 2001 was the year that saw the colour change in fire trucks from lime green to red.

Aurelio Fernandes thanked the speaker.
